

# Glossary of Terms for License Lookup

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**Active** – The program is licensed to provide services and may operate.

**Adult Day Care Services** (also known as Adult Day Services): A nonresidential program licensed to provide services to functionally impaired adults on a regular basis for periods of less than 24 hours a day in a setting other than a participant's home or the residence of the facility operator. Services are individualized, coordinated and directed at maintaining or improving the participants' capabilities for self-care, and may include health services, social services, and nutritional services.

**Adult Foster Care:** A 24-hour-a-day program licensed to provide food, lodging, protection, supervision, and household services to functionally impaired adults in a residence. Services may also include the provision of personal care, household and living skills assistance or training, medication assistance, and assistance in safeguarding cash resources.

**Application Withdrawn** – The applicant withdrew the license application.

**Chemical Dependency Treatment:** A nonresidential or residential program licensed to provide treatment services to individuals who exhibit a pattern of chemical abuse or chemical dependency. Treatment includes an assessment of the client's needs, development of planned interventions or services to address those needs, provision of services, facilitation of services provided by other service providers, and reassessment with the goal to assist or support the client's efforts to alter the client's harmful pattern of chemical use.

**Child Care Center:** A nonresidential program licensed to provide child care in a facility to promote the physical, intellectual, social, and emotional development of a child in the absence of the parent for a period of less than 24 hours a day.

**Child Caring-Placing Agency:** A program licensed to receive a child or help plan the placement of a child for care, supervision, or placement in foster care or adoption.

**Child Foster Care:** A residential program licensed to provide care, food, lodging, training, education, supervision, or treatment to one or more children, which for any reason cannot be furnished by a parent or guardian in the child's home.

**Children's Residential Facilities:** A residential program licensed to provide temporary care or treatment for children in out-of-home placement, including 24-hour-a-day care, supervision, food, lodging, rehabilitation, training, education, or treatment outside of the child's home.

**Closed** – The program has closed and is no longer licensed to provide services.

**Conditional** – The license to operate has been placed on conditional status and compliance with special terms of licensure is required for the license holder to continue to operate.

**Conditional: Subject to Appeal** – An order of conditional license has been issued to the license holder, and the license holder has a right to appeal the decision. We are waiting to determine if the license holder will appeal the decision. The program may continue to operate.

**Conditional: Under Appeal** – An order of conditional license has been issued to the license holder, and the license holder has appealed that decision. Pending the outcome of the appeal, the license holder may operate the program without complying with the special terms of licensure that were ordered. The outcome of the appeal will determine if the license holder must comply with the order.

**Crisis Respite Services:** Services for persons with developmental disabilities for specific short-term care and intervention due to a caregiver's need for relief or support or protection of the person with developmental disabilities or others living with that person. These services may address both medical and behavioral needs.

**Day Training and Habilitation Services:** Services provided to adults with developmental disabilities to help them develop and maintain life skills, participate in community life and engage in proactive and satisfying activities of their own choosing.

**Denied** – An applicant for licensure was denied a license because the applicant failed to meet licensing requirements. The applicant is not licensed to provide services.

**Denied: Subject to Appeal** – An order denying a license application has been issued to the applicant because the applicant failed to meet licensing requirements, and the applicant has a right to appeal the decision. We are waiting to determine if the applicant will appeal the decision. The applicant is not licensed to provide services and may not operate even if the applicant appeals.

**Denied: Under Appeal** – An order denying a license application has been issued to the applicant because the applicant failed to meet licensing requirements, and the applicant has appealed that decision. The applicant is not licensed to provide services and may not operate during the appeal.

**Detox Services:** A residential program licensed to provide short-term care on a 24-hour a day basis for the purpose of detoxifying clients and facilitating access to chemical dependency treatment as indicated by an assessment of needs.

**DOC-Child Foster Care:** Child foster care that is provided in a residential facility licensed by the Department of Corrections.

**Emergency Relative Foster Care:** A temporary residential license that allows a child to be placed with a relative, who is not licensed to provide child foster care, while the relative pursues a child foster care license.

**Family Adult Day Services:** A program licensed to provide services in the license holder's primary residence for a period of less than 24 hours per day to no more than eight functionally impaired adults, none of which are under age 55, have serious or persistent mental illness, or have mental retardation or a related condition. Services are individualized and coordinated and directed at maintaining or improving the participants' capabilities for self-care, and may include health services, social services, and nutritional service.

**Family Child Care:** A program licensed in a residence to provide child care to 14 or fewer children in order to promote the physical, intellectual, social, and emotional development of the children in the absence of the parent for a period of less than 24 hours a day. There are also special family child care programs providing child care at locations other than the license holder's own residence.

**Independent Living Assistance for Youth:** A nonresidential program licensed to provide independent living assistance for youth, which may include training, counseling, instruction, supervision, and assistance according to the youth's independent living plan.

**Mental Health Center/Clinic:** A certification issued to a mental health clinic or center that provides clinical services in the treatment of mental illness so the center is eligible to claim reimbursement for outpatient clinical services from insurance companies.

**Psychopathic Personality:** Secure treatment programs located at Moose Lake and St. Peter Security Hospital for persons committed or in the process of commitment by the courts as a person with a sexual psychopathic personality or sexually dangerous person.

**Residential Facilities for Adults with Mental Illness:** A residential program licensed to provide residential treatment and rehabilitation services to adults with mental illness on a 24-hour per day basis. The services may include intensive residential treatment services or crisis stabilization services.

**Residential Habilitation Services:** Services provided to persons with developmental disabilities, who cannot live in their homes without such services or who need outside support to remain in their homes. Habilitation services are provided in the person's residence and in the community, and are directed towards increasing and maintaining the person's physical, intellectual, emotional and social functioning. Residential habilitation services include:

- In-Home Family Support (IHFS): Services provided to persons and their families, including extended family members who are not providing licensed foster care, in the families' home and in the community to enable the persons to remain in or return to their homes.

- Supported Living Services (SLS) for Children: Services provided to persons under 18 years of age who require daily staff intervention due to severe behavior problems, medical conditions, physical deficits and lack of adequate survival skills that result in the family's inability to maintain the child in their home. SLS for children may be provided in a family style home with no more than three other persons that is outside of the biological or adoptive home and where the home allows for community integration.
- Supported Living Services (SLS) for Adults: Services provided to adults who require daily staff intervention due to behavior problems, medical conditions, physical deficits and lack of adequate survival skills. SLS for adults may be provided in an adult foster home, the community, or a person's own place of residence.

**Residential Programs And Services For Physically Disabled:** A residential program licensed to provide medical, developmental, and rehabilitative services for the care and treatment of five or more persons with physical disabilities on a 24-hour per day basis.

**Residential Services, ICF/DD certified:** A residential facility that provides health or rehabilitative services to persons with developmental disabilities who require active treatment. The facility is also licensed by the Minnesota Department of Health as a health care institution and certified as an Intermediate Care Facility for Persons with Developmental Disabilities (ICF/DD).

**Residential Services, Non-ICF/DD certified:** A residential facility that provides supervision, lodging, meals, counseling, developmental habilitation or rehabilitation services under a Minnesota Department of Health license to serve five to more adults with developmental disabilities (DD). The facility may also serve adults who are chemically dependent, mentally ill, or physically disabled, but the services provided to non-DD individuals are governed by other licensing standards.

**Revoked** – The license holder's license has been taken away due to serious or chronic violations of the licensing requirements. The program is not licensed to operate.

**Revoked: Subject to Appeal** – An order revoking the license has been issued to the license holder due to serious or chronic violations of the licensing requirements, and the license holder has a right to appeal the decision. We are waiting to determine if the license holder will appeal the decision. Pending their decision to appeal, the license holder may continue to operate the program.

**Revoked: Under Appeal** – An order revoking the license has been issued due to serious or chronic violations of the licensing requirements, and the license holder has appealed that decision. Pending the outcome of the appeal, the license holder may continue to operate the program. The outcome of the appeal will determine if the license holder must comply with the order.

**Semi-Independent Living Services:** Services provided to adults with developmental disabilities to help them successfully live in the community, enable them to achieve personally desired outcomes, and lead self-directed lives.

**Supported Employment Services:** Services funded under the developmental disabilities (DD) home and community-based services waiver to provide adults with developmental disabilities, for whom competitive employment is unlikely, intensive ongoing support so they may perform in a work setting. Persons receiving this service must be in a paid employment situation.

**Suspended** – The license has been suspended due to violations of licensing requirements. The program may not operate while the license is suspended.

**Suspended: Subject to Appeal** – An order suspending the license has been issued to the license holder due to violations of licensing requirements, and the license holder has a right to appeal the decision. We are waiting to determine if the license holder will appeal the decision. Pending their decision to appeal, the license holder may continue to operate the program.

**Suspended: Under Appeal** – An order suspending the license has been issued to the license holder due to violations of licensing requirements, and the license holder has appealed that decision. Pending the outcome of the appeal, the license holder may continue to operate the program. The outcome of the appeal will determine if the license holder must comply with the order.

**Temporary Immediate Suspension** – The license holder's license has been suspended immediately based on imminent risk of harm. The license holder may not operate the program.

**Temporary Immediate Suspension: Subject to Appeal** – An order immediately suspending the license has been issued to the license holder based on imminent risk of harm. The license holder has a right to appeal the decision. We are waiting to determine if the license holder will appeal the decision. The license holder may not operate the program.

**Temporary Immediate Suspension: Under Appeal** – An order immediately suspending the license has been issued to the license holder based on imminent risk of harm. The license holder has appealed that decision. Pending the outcome of the appeal, the license holder may not operate the program.
